

# INVITATION LAYOUT

If you plan on printing your invitations at home, you'll need to layout your files to ensure ease of cutting once finished. Use the "Align" functions to make sure borders are identical and symmetrical.

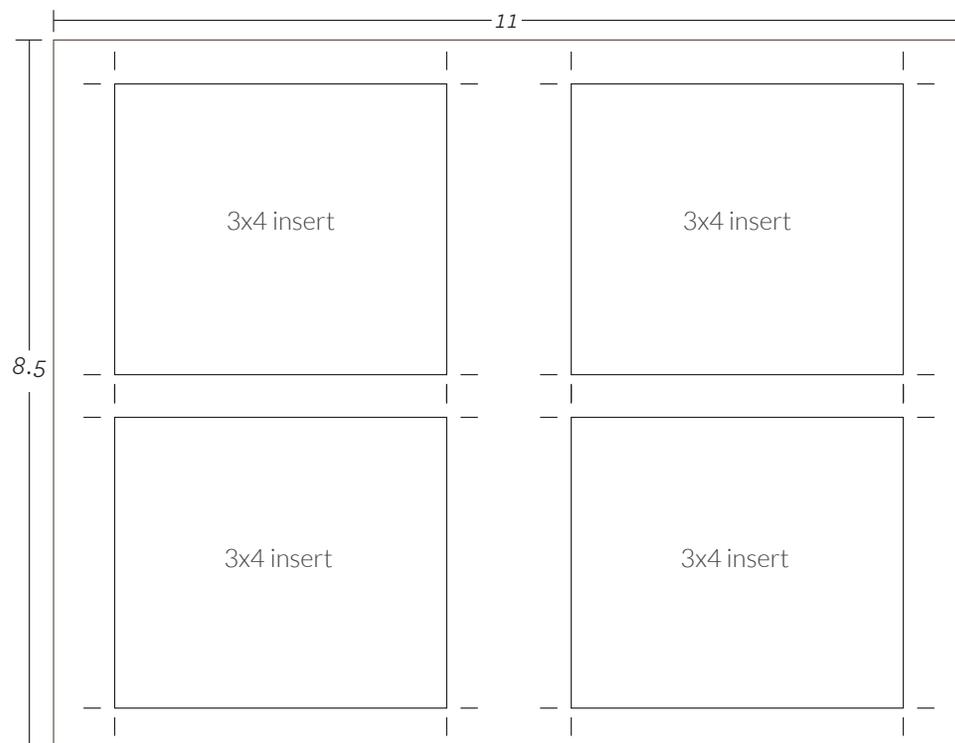
If you plan on printing your invitations at a print shop, they can typically layout your files for you, but will likely charge you a fee. If you don't feel confident you can setup your files properly, it is worth the extra money to have them laid out by the professionals. It will save you time, and likely money at the print shop if they do not have to deconstruct an improperly setup file.
